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

When most women "ride," they usually have their choice of music and enough mirrors

to enjoy beautiful views of themselves. But these ladies, in particular, ride with style and grace....on two wheels with loud motor pipes. Standing tall as Arkansas' first all women's motorcyle club founded by a minority, the Nu Millennium Ryders take pride in their motorcycles on and off the road.

Founded by LaTonya Williams in July of 2010, the Nu Millenium Ryders were introduced at the SugarTown Annual Field Meet and currently has 14 members. Williams, also known as 2-Cute, built the club for women riders only, bridging the gap between male and female riders.

"I made the decision to become an 'all women's crew' to build a new foundation among women riders. The motorcycle community is a male dominated society," said Williams (2 Cute). "However, women

### riders are becoming a major factor in the motorcycle club and social club community."

Nu Millenium is branched into two clubs: the motorcycle club and the social club. The motorcycle club includes the ladies that are licensed to ride motorcycles while the social club involves members who assist in community and business development. Although the clubs share small differences, they have bonded a sisterhood that could hold strong even on one wheel.

"Although we function as one big club, there are not any Ryders in the Social Club, but members of the Social Club always have the option to cross over to the Ryder side once they have purchased their motorcycle and gained their license. There are a few of our members that are in the process of doing that now," said Temeca Wiggins, president of the social club. "Becoming a part of Nu Millennium Social Club is fairly easy. You prospect for 2 to 3 months, and during this time the club is getting to know you as person, and you are learning the ins and outs of being a part of our sisterhood."

The club utilizes their time in the community among other riders as well as participating in charitable events and strongly supporting the Cancer Society. Their values are highly based on support, respect, growth and knowledge. Celebrating two years of riding and giving, the club looks forward to adding more members to ride and commute socially. Anyone can join....but under one exception: no men! But of course, the club is opened to any interested party through application and an initiation period.

Nu Millenium is not only a leading organization of females on bikes, they're also determined in establishing a foundation for the next generation. Members range from age 23 to 45 and strive to be positive role models for younger women and men. So what's riding like a girl all about?

Sister Friends United not only honored these women of excellence, they sponsored higher education to young women and highlighted the fact that it takes your sister-friends to lift you up when you need it most.


"We just continue to grow, continue to have faith and we just want to continue to be that beacon of light in the community," said Rhonda

Aaron. "We help give back to those not only in need- whether it's the holidays for families or Ronald McDonald house...we just want to continue to do our part."







Also, you can sense when your stomach is getting full so it best to find you stopping point and not overeat.
- Balance your food choices-If you're familiar with the food pyramid, you know that it's always best to try to have all levels of nutrition on one plate. Also, a whole meal does not have to be fried; Try getting something baked, grilled or sautéed to add to a meal instead.



- Whake changes progressively- Of course, you won't change overnight if you start today. But pay more attention to what you're eating and how you're eating it. Pretty soon it will turn into a natural pattern.
- € Eat with self-control- Foods are not really good or bad, it's all how you and your body take it. When eating foods that make you feel guilty, drink water with it or make sure you can work it off afterwards. Try to eat light snacks at night especially if you



With Exotic Expression, one can benefit weight loss as well as define major areas on the body including the abdomen, triceps, biceps, hamstrings and calves. Most routines include much leg movement and stretching of arms and abdomen and are done in sets, similiar to regular workouts. Currently located in Lulav's throughout the week, Tammy plans to step it up a notch in the future.

"The routines are nothing major...it's just a lot of attitude and confidence along with a few body movements and you have got it down," said Tammy. "I would love for this class to become something that women want to do every week, at least two to three nights a week."
