Crenchaw. Ironically, Mr. Crenchaw was the inspiration behind my book, "Pioneering African-American Aviators featuring the Tuskegee Airmen of Arkansas" which also highlights Aviatrix and "Dear Success Seeker" contributor Mildred L. Hemmons Carter alongside a handful of other notable women trailblazers of Black Aviation.

And moreover, with today being the 49th anniversary of <u>Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s</u> famed "I Have a Dream" speech (delivered during the August 28, 1963 Washington D.C. Civil Rights March). I am glad that we – as authors and community trailblazers – can collaborate to use our past histories and future hopes to inspire today's generations to not only have a dream but successfully pursue their dreams.
